**List of Manuscripts Relating to India and Ceylon Held in the
National Library of Scotland**

National Library of Scotland, situated in the city center of Edinburgh, is one of the most important collections of books, maps, manuscripts and documents in Great Britain. It was opened in 1689 as the Library of Advocates. In 1710, when the First Copy Right Act of Queen Anne, also known as Statue of Anne, was passed; the National Library of Scotland, British Library, London and three other libraries were given the right to claim a copy of every book published in the Great Britain. NLS enjoys this privilege till today and as a result, almost 5000 books are sent to this library every week. It is the largest library in Scotland that provides the best facilities to researchers, academics and writers and is considered the world's leading archive for books and manuscripts on the history and culture of Scotland. There are a number of rare items in the library including the first printed book; the Gutenberg Bible of 1455. Antiquarian books are preserved and repaired through traditional craft as well as the modern technology. There is also a huge collection of historic maps in the library.¹

Apart from the material on the history of Scotland, the National Library of Scotland has a great collection of documents, personal papers, letters, maps and records of the colonial era in South Asia. There are also numerous volumes of catalogues and guidebooks to search for the required material. However, there are some valuable collections on South Asia which have not been listed in any of these catalogues or guidebooks. To access such material, a hand list is available to researchers; which gives brief information about the sources on India and Ceylon. This list includes collections, manuscripts and other items related to the two countries. It aptly warns that it should not be considered a comprehensive list of

Extracts from the correspondence of Cornwallis are printed by Charles Ross in his edition of Cornwallis's Correspondence, 2nd edition, 1859, with some errors in transcription. The extensive portions not printed by Ross treat of all the affairs, civil and military, which are the subject of those retained by him, and of other matters, such as the advantages of stations in and beyond the Bay of Bengal. The papers have also been used in A Aspinall, Cornwallis in Bengal, 1931.

MS.5386 is a history of the Carnatic, 1765-75, probably compiled by Stuart from the material collected in the other notebooks.

MSS.5387-8 Correspondence of and concerning Stuart, 1766, 1776-93, mostly concerning his arrest of Sir George Pigot, Governor of Madras, in 1776, and the administration of Tanjore, 1777. These letters are mainly copies sent by Stuart to his brother Andrew, the lawyer and politician, in order that he might defend him against charges brought before the governing body of the East India Co.

Papers concerning the voyage of the Gatton to Bengal and Madras in 1778-80, consisting mainly of bonds and of accounts for ship's supplies and goods shipped to India. The log for this voyage is preserved in the India Office Library, London.
